Originally formed in 1992 in Newtown, Australia, The Whitlams have been entertaining audiences for over ten years and have since become one of Australia's favourite bands. With two platinum albums and numerous ARIA awards, their unique style and unforgettable songs have made them an integral part of the Australian music industry.

In 1998, The Whitlams were nominated for eight ARIA awards and as a result won three for Best Group and Best Independent Release for their album *Eternal Nightcap* and for Song of the Year, *No Aphrodisiac*. With their non-hyped,
